

2025 Louisiana Legislative Priorities

Victory in the fight against cancer requires bold new public policies that promote cancer prevention, early detection of cancer, and expand access to quality, affordable health care. Lawmakers make many decisions that impact the lives of Louisianans impacted by cancer and their leadership is vital to defeating this disease. In 2025, the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN) will work with the state legislature on legislative and regulatory efforts that provide affordable, adequate access to health insurance including Medicaid, ensure adequate funding for lifesaving cancer screening and prevention programs, and enact prevention policies to protect kids from tobacco products and help support those who are trying to quit. We will be making the following fact-based policies a priority and ask for your support:

Cancer Prevention and Early Detection

- **Breast and Cervical Cancer:** ACS CAN will advocate to maintain funding of \$700,000 for the Louisiana Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, the state breast and cervical cancer screening program for low-income uninsured and underinsured women administered by the Louisiana State University New Orleans' School of Public Health.
- **Prostate Cancer:** The higher incidence and mortality rates for Black men for prostate cancer are exceptionally concerning. ACS CAN supports improving prostate screening rates and reducing disparities by advocating for appropriate screening measures. This includes policies that would give men at high-risk for prostate cancer improved access to prostate cancer screening by requiring health insurance coverage for evidence-based prostate cancer preventive care and screenings, without cost sharing.

Reducing the Toll of Tobacco

- **Tobacco Taxes:** As the state works to identify revenue strategies to fund critical programs, ACS CAN will advocate to increase the cigarette tax by \$1.50 per pack with a parallel tax on all other tobacco products including e-cigarettes. Increasing the price of cigarettes and all other tobacco products through regular and significant tobacco tax increases helps prevent kids from starting to use tobacco and helps support people who are trying to quit. A portion of this revenue from the tobacco tax increase should be used to fund and sustain fact-based, statewide tobacco prevention and cessation programs. Increasing funding will allow state funded tobacco control programs to expand their education, cessation, and data collection efforts.
- **Smoke-free Air:** ACS CAN will continue to work to pass policies to eliminate smoking in bars and casinos in municipalities around the state. In 2006, the state legislature took the first step to reduce secondhand smoke exposure by eliminating smoking in restaurants and most non-hospitality workplaces. However, the legislature decided to exempt bars and gaming facilities. We can protect the health of ALL workers, by closing the policy gaps left in 2006. Currently, over 30 municipalities have already implemented their own comprehensive smoke-free laws. Comprehensive smoke-free policies protect everyone's right to breathe clean air in all workplaces whether they work or visit a restaurant, bar, or gaming establishment.

Cancer Research Funding

• **State Cancer Registry**: ACS CAN will work to protect state funding of \$500,000 for the Louisiana Tumor Registry, a statewide population-based registry that compiles data to help guide scientific research for state cancer control efforts.

Local Control

• ACS CAN supports the authority of local governments to pass local policies that go beyond state laws to help families be healthy, safe and secure. Policymaking at the local level allows innovation and creative problem solving that builds on local strengths and addresses local needs. ACS CAN works at the local, state and federal levels to ensure everyone has a fair and just opportunity to prevent, fight and survive cancer. ACS CAN will oppose legislation that restricts the freedom of local leaders to best serve your shared constituents.
