Since 2001, as the American Cancer Society's nonprofit, nonpartisan advocacy affiliate, ACS CAN has successfully advocated for billions of dollars in cancer research funding, expanded access to quality affordable health care, and advanced proven tobacco control measures. We stand with our volunteers, working to change public policy to end cancer as we know it, for everyone.

2025 Local Priorities

Medicaid Expansion Protection

ACS CAN is dedicated to ensuring that low-income individuals and families have access to comprehensive health insurance through state Medicaid programs. We actively support policies that protect Medicaid funding and access for low-income parents and adults. This includes opposing any changes that would reduce coverage, benefits, eligibility, or quality of care, while also advocating for improvements to Medicaid systems.

Since its voter-mandated implementation in 2020, Medicaid expansion in Idaho has significantly reduced Idaho's uninsured rate. It has provided more than 100,000 Idahoans—who otherwise could not afford a marketplace plan—with access to quality insurance and life-saving health care. This coverage is particularly vital for rural Idahoans and the health care systems that serve them.

Tobacco Appropriations

ACS CAN will advocate for increased funding for evidence-based, statewide tobacco prevention and cessation programs. These programs aim to prevent youth from starting tobacco use and provide support for those trying to quit.

Impact of ACS CAN

Led the cancer community to secure a total of \$7.32 billion for cancer research at the National Cancer Institute (NCI), including a \$408 million increase as part of a \$2.5 billion increase for biomedical research at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to help lead to innovative future therapies.

Protected and secured \$1.93 billion in state appropriations through advocacy to help fund cancer research and programs that reduce the tobacco burden and increase access to screenings.

Launched a digital and social media campaign on Medicaid expansion, with the animated film, Access Denied: The Injustice of the Medicaid Coverage Gap, which garnered over 19.8k views on social media platforms and generated more than 2,400 new Medicaid expansion advocates.
