

Commercial Tobacco and LGBTQ+ People

- People who identify as lesbian and gay are 27% more likely to smoke cigarettes than heterosexual individuals, and people who identify as bisexual are 66% more likely to smoke.
- People who identify as transgender are more likely than cisgender individuals to smoke cigarettes (17% versus 14%).
- About 36% of LGBT people that smoke use menthol cigarettes compared to 29% of heterosexual individuals that smoke.
- Higher smoking rates among LGBTQ+ people are often in response to intense stress caused by homophobia, transphobia, and discrimination coupled with Big Tobacco's unjust targeting of the community.
- Cigarette smoking increases the risk of lung cancer by 25-fold and increases the risk of at least 11 other cancers.
